Planning

A Telecommunications Mast at Church Farm, Huntington?

At its meeting on the 17th December 2008, the City of York's Planning Committee refused Vodaphone's application to erect a 23.4m mast at Church Farm, Huntington in the meadow bordering the River Foss. The River Foss Society objected to the proposal, as did several members in an individual capacity. Since then Vodaphone has resubmitted the proposal, lowering the proposed mast by 3 metres. The River Foss Society has renewed its objections: it is not the height of the mast that is the problem but its location in the green belt and in a well used and much loved natural environment.

An Otter Mystery

The body of an otter was spotted on the Strensall Road between Earswick and the Towthorpe turning by Member Chris Dunn. He dashed home to get his camera but when he got back there was no sign of the otter. This happened on Thursday 12th February (the day it snowed) at about 7.45 am. Does anyone have any information, please?

If you happen to find a dead otter, please report it <u>immediately</u> to Will Durrant, tel 640198. This is for two good reasons. If the casualty is a female in milk, a search for her kittens can be carried out which could save their lives. Secondly, the body can be sent off for a post-mortem which will add to our knowledge of otters.
